## Isaiah 36,37

- This is a crisis time Assyrian invasion up to the very gates of Jerusalem. Sennacherib, King of Assyria is leading the main army (37:37)
- It takes place at the same location as the failure of earlier King Ahaz (36:2, 7:3)
- The threat has 2 phases and 2 responses in between which the army moves north (v.8) because 5. does not want to be using resources to fight the King of Egypt AND to beseige Jerusalem

## Questions:

- 1. What is the argument and reasons put forward by the field commander. What about it makes it intimidating, and what makes it ineffective?
- 2. What way does Hezekiah respond in vv1-2, and 14-20. What are the ingredients of 14-20? are they powerful? In what way?
- 3. vv22-35 What does God promise, what are his stated motivations and explanations for doing so?
- 4. Why do you think vv36-38 are so brief? Can we learn anything from this?
