## What's Christianity all about?

#### it's all about "faith"

 Faith is knowing enough about the trustworthiness of the object that you are prepared to trust them

- When you can't see how it's going to work out
- When you can't see how it will end up

Versus

- Rationalism = I will only trust when I can see the whole explanation myself
- Mysticism = I will only trust if it feels right (so Luke Skywalker)
- Moralism = it is about doing the right rituals, and keeping the right rules

N.B. Christians are justified by faith

N.B. Christians walk by faith (and not by sight)

==> if we don't feed our faith on God's word, we shall fall!

# Tell the story 4 things you should know

#### The Assyrian threat - chapter 36

As the vast Assyrian army have defeated the ring of fortified cities around Jerusalem ... (36:1) the Assyrian field-commander (+2 + army) approaches Jerusalem itself

- The place ... near upper pool (36:2)
- Met by 3 of King's officials (36:3)

- Speech #1

• "what are you trusting in? (36:4)"

 reply - please speak in Official Language (36:11), not ordinary Language

Answer: "ordinary people will be eating their poo" (36:12)

- Speech #2

Assyrian is the great King - don't trust Hezekiah + LORD

• Submit to me (v.16)

- How can the LORD deliver Jerusalem? (v.20)
- Appalled Silence and torn clothes
- -==> pretty frightening!

## Chapter 37 - Hezekiah prays:

#### Hezekiah

- Goes to the temple, torn clothes = sad/serious
- Sends the 3 to Isaiah the prophet
  - They are ridiculing the living God (v.4)
  - Please pray for people left (v.4)!
- ==> good reaction and spiritual perception

Isaiah:


- Do not be afraid, he blasphemed me, I will send him back, I will have him killed (v.7)
- Sennacherib
  - Gets diverted, but sends a threatening letter

Hezekiah show the letter to LORD and prays

- "you are enthroned! .. let the kingdoms know that you are God"
- ==> good prayer!

Isaiah sends message

- Assyria boasts, I the LORD planned, you will survive
- This is the city of David (v.35)
- Result: 185 thousands, killed
  - Sennacherib killed back home
  - ==> praise LORD who fulfils his promise and defends his people!



### Footnote (almost): the Babylonian fact-finders

Babylon - Merodach-Baladan

- Ancient irredeemable enemy, land far away.
- "we're so please to hear of your recovery" +gifts
- H. shows off his gold (boastful, foolish??)
- Isaiah asks- what? Where? (39:3,4)
- Isaiah says:
  - It will all be carried away to Babylon
  - The royal family will become exiles and fruitless
- Hezekiah says
  - Says "good"
  - Thinks "peace and security in my lifetime"
    - ==> even the best of men is limited!

- 1. This city and this king has been the subject of multiple previous promises and warnings
  - God called Abraham ... through you will all the nations be blessed
    - + "he was looking forward to a city" Hebrews 11:10
    - God founded a nation through Moses
      - Blessings to the appreciative obedient nation
      - Curses upon the disobedient nation
      - Including warning of exile to a foreign country Deuteronomy 28:64
  - God founded Zion as the city of King David
    - David's throne for ever
    - · City of holiness for ever
    - BUT this earthly city had already failed in many ways
      - e.g. "full of idols" 2:8. like the pagan nations (2:6)
    - ==> according to God's eternal plan. Like us ("he chose us before the creation of the world to be holy ..." Ephesians 1:4



- 2. This is a re-play of a generation previously (Isaiah 7:2)
  - King Ahaz (Hezekiah's father)
  - Similar threat 7:2
  - Same place 7:3
  - Told to trust in LORD (7:9)
  - Offered a sign (7:10)
  - Warned that Assyria would be poison not protection (7:17)
- This time round:
  - Hezekiah prayed ... trusted
    - It worked!
    - ==> if LORD is truly Almighty, faith is a realistic option!

3. This was a triumph of faith - Against fear (threats) - Against theological deception ("LORD told me") Against temptation (e.g. Egypt's offers of security) - IT WORKED! ==> Christians need to learn to walk

by faith, to see things by faith, to value things by faith, to act out of faith



4. This was a failure of hope (?)

Hezekiah still isn't the Saviour

- "the virgin will conceive and bear a son and will call him Immanuel" 7:2
- "a shoot from the stump of Jesse [= David's father] the Spirit of the LORD will rest on him" 11:1
- IT'S NOT Hezekiah, ... he sends his people into exile
- The best earthly King is still flawed
  - Even though he defied death ... temporarily, not permanently
  - He could not redeem the terrible sins of the next generation
- BUT Jesus IS THE PERFECT SAVIOUR
- They looked forward to HIM
- Aren't we pleased he came!
