




Jesus' compassion expressed in gospel mission How do we encounter Jesus?

- Via dreams, visions, impressions, feelings
- ... via the words he gave to his apostles?
- i.e. through the Book?


How important are the apostolic writings?

- i.e. can we truly say "I follow Jesus, but have a problem with the rest of the New Testament e.g. Paul?"



a hinge point in stages of the advancement of the kingdom

- From catalogue of Messiah's single-handed works
- To instructions for Messiah's multiple workers
- it's made of compassion
- The 12 are remarkable & unique extensions of Jesus' own ministry



Instructions:


- Preach "the Kingdom of heaven draws-close"
 - Do we have exactly the same good news?
 - Christ died for our sins, rose, and is coming back.
- They demonstrate the signs of the imminent kingdom
- In this passage... travelling and accommodation instructions at this stage of mission

Much the same thing said in 2 different ways as they go to "Jacobsville-on-sea":

a. greeting of peace brought and received

Enquire for a "worthy" house [in the village]

- house = people
- Worthy = ?? most suitable for the kingdom
- See also: 10:10 "worthy of wages" 10:37,38 "worthy of me"




Much the same thing said in 2 different ways:

a. peace not received - but not wasted


"Worthy house" is actually not worthy

- Not Worthy = most suitable for the kingdom
- i.e. a crisis / life deciding encounter!




b. words not received

- If they don't welcome you and-not hear your words
- [N.B. person <> word]
- "Shake the dust off your feet"



b. words not received

- If they don't welcome you and-not hear your words
- More bearable for Sodom and Gomorrah



- 1. there was a historic last chance decision-time given to Israel
 - This was almost totally rejected
- ==> there is such a thing as last chance
- e.g. health, mental ability, opportunity
- N.B. "count the cost" takes time!
- But, if you can see the issues clearly, don't delay any further
- N.B. Jewish people are still welcome, made jealous by the grace shown to the Gentiles

2. rejection of privilege is tremblingly blameworthy

"shake the dust off your feet" v.14

- = treat them as a Gentile city

"more tolerable for *Sodom and Gomorrah* on the day of judgment"

Blameworthiness: Sodom and Gomorrah were wicked cities, the most notable sin being homosexual rape

BUT "Jacobsville-on-sea" will face greater judgment

- Because of the privilege they had, but rejected!
- Likewise the imaginary cathedral city of "Rochester-inthe-woods" which has had 900 years of Christian witness but had rejected the faith
- Or western europe
- Or children brought up in a Christian family

3. the last chance comes in the form of the apostles and the apostolic words

- i.e. you can't separate
 - · Christ from his words
 - The apostles from Christ
 - The apostles from their words
- Q: is it not completely impossible then to claim to have Christ while simultaneously rejecting the words of the apostles??
- e.g. "Paul got it wrong about sexual ethics"
- e.g. "Paul got it wrong about the wrath-bearing nature of the atonement"

4. the overtures /approaches / invitations of the kingdom are not wasted

- Peace can be rejected
- But the peace does not disappear, it returns to the sender
- ??? maybe more than that
 - Rejection in one place leads to blessing in another
 - Rejection by the villages of Israel led to rejoicing in the cities of the nations
- Let us appreciate and daily stand on the gospel!
- Let's be active spreading "peace of the gospel"
- Let's be optimistic that even rejection is not wasted.
