



Verifying the sin

Deuteronomy 19:15



The Elders


Examples in 'rightdoing' and wrongdoing

For:

- Prevention in sin
- Reverence (respect) of God's Word

Requires:

A 'balanced' view of our Elders



I (solemnly) charge you, in the sight of God and Christ Jesus and the elect angels, to keep these instructions without partiality, and to do nothing out of favouritism.

<u>Prejudice -</u>

Prejudgement

Favourtism -

Showing favour

Neither are an unbiased and fair analysis!

Establishing the truth of sin needs careful conversation and prayer





"Do not be hasty in the laying on of hands, and do not share in the sins of others. Keep yourself pure."

Don't be too quick to appoint elders/deacons (But don't wait forever.. The church needs leaders)



Make sure you keep yourself pure by not establishing corrupt leaders

Requires time and prayer!





"Stop drinking only water, and use a little wine because of your stomach and your frequent illnesses."



Take care of your body (1 Corinthians 6:19-20)

Use what God has given you in a God-honouring way

Your health is important – for service and as an example to others

"The sins of some are obvious, reaching the place of judgement ahead of them; the sins of others trail behind them."

- Obvious sin = goes ahead of the person = Leads them into judgement
 They still need care and conversation!
- Hidden sin = not obvious = It turns up later..
 Potentially damaging to the church

Confessing our sins is important for the health of the church – and each other!

"Therefore confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous person is powerful and effective."

James 5:16

Look for hidden positive things too!





"So God created man in his own image, in the image of God he created him, male and female he created them."

Genesis 1:27

- All Christians are to be obedient to God's word (despite difficult circumstances, I.e. slavery)
- All people are made in the image of God
- Even the worst of sinners need to be shown God's love
